Encountering the presence, holiness, and glory of the LORD in the age of the Tabernacle was a harrowing experience.

• Exo 20:18-21 - Israel at Mount Sinai - "Do not let God speak to us, lest we die."



When HEARTS Don't TREMBLE

- Exo 28:1-43 priestly garments "so that he does not die" (35) ... "lest they bear guilt and die" (43).
- Exo 30:20 bronze basin "they shall wash their hands and their feet, so that they may not die."
- · Lev 8:35 consecration of Aaron and his sons "remain ... so that you do not die."
- Lev 16:2 the Day of Atonement "not ... at any time into the Holy Place ... so that he may not die."

Passages like this give us a glimpse into the awesome majesty and inexpressible transcendence of Almighty God (2 Sam 6:2; 2 Kings 19:15; Psa 22:3; Psa 29; Psa 99).

"Let the peoples tremble!" But what happens when they don't? What happens when we don't?
