Our great privilege and responsibility is to rise and build. Philippians 1:1 provides a great snapshot of a few of the indispensable elements of a healthy church.

Three words to enhance our understanding	
•	diakonos (noun):, helper, minister, deacon (Matt 20:25-26; John 12:26)
•	diakoneo (verb): to serve, care for, help, (1 Pet 4:10-11; Matt 20:28)
•	diakonia (noun): service or (1 Cor 16:15; Luke 10:40)
W	hen the Bible mentions deacons, what can we learn?
•	In the infant days of the church (Acts 2:42-47; 4:32-35) a conflict began to brew (6:1-7) which, if mishandled, could have led to terrible disruption and division.
	Physical needs are affirmed, but on the church's spiritual health isn't lost.
	"Men of good, full of the and of" are appointed to meet the tangible needs and help preserve the unity of the church.
•	As the gospel is proclaimed and elders are appointed in every church (14:21-23), deacons are needed to recognize and meet a variety of tangible needs (Phil 1:1).
•	By the time we reach 1 Timothy 3, we find Paul describing what should happen in every church by emphasizing what sort of men these are to be (3:8-13).
	As evangelists serve with hands full of work (2 Tim 4:1-2, 5)
	and shepherds serve with hands full of work (1 Pet 5:1-2)
	deacons serve with hands full of tangible work with the same purpose in mind—the building of the of Christ (Eph 4:12).
