

What is grace? We learned on Sunday morning that grace is undeserved blessing. Okay, but what does that mean? What's it look like? On Wednesdays this month, we'll be looking at faces of grace—examples of real people in the Bible who gave and received grace.

First up, _____ and his brothers.

When Joseph was 30 years old, he was a *really* important person in the land of Egypt (Gen 41:37-43).



But life hadn't always been easy for Joseph.

Joseph was a part of a big family—he was the _____ of 12 sons of Jacob, and Joseph was his father's favorite (Gen 37:1-4). Joseph had some strange dreams about his family bowing down to him that made his brothers hate him even more (Gen 37:8). One day, when his father had sent Joseph to check on his brothers, they got so jealous that they threw Joseph in a pit (Gen 37:18-24) and sold him to some merchants on their way to Egypt (Gen 37:25-28).

Life didn't get easier for Joseph as a slave in Egypt. When he did the right thing, he was thrown in prison (Gen 39), but eventually, Pharaoh—the king of Egypt—had some strange dreams that no one could interpret (Gen 41)...except Joseph. A great famine was coming, so Pharaoh put Joseph in charge of all the food. And who eventually came looking for help? Joseph's

_____ (Gen 42:6). Now, what would Joseph do?

For Class & Family Discussion:

- When someone has been unkind to us, is it always easy to be kind to them?
- If someone has been mean to us, what might we feel like they deserve?
- Let's read Genesis 45:1-11 together in our Bibles.
 - Why were Joseph's brothers afraid of him?
 - What was Joseph willing to do for his brothers, even though they had been very hurtful to him?
- Years later, Jacob—the father of these 12 sons—died, and Joseph's brothers got worried again that Joseph might give them what they "deserved." Let's read **Genesis 50:15-21** together.
 - What do you think Joseph meant when he asked, "Am I in the place of God?"
 - Joseph showed grace to his brothers—he gave them an undeserved blessing.
- Let's end in Romans 12:14 and 12:17-21. Are there times we need to be like Joseph?
