

Is idolatry still a thing? We learned on Sunday that it most certainly is. On Wednesdays throughout this month, we'll look at a few of the idols that seem to trip many of us up in the 21st century.



First up: **the idol of control**. As a case study, consider Aaron at the foot of Mount Sinai as the people say:

"Up, make us gods who shall ______ us. As for this Moses, the man who brought us up out of the land of Egypt, we do not _____ what has become of him." So Aaron said to them, "Take off the rings of gold that are in the ears of your wives, your sons, and your daughters, and bring them to me." ... And he received the gold from their hand and fashioned it with a graving tool and made a golden calf. And they said, "These are your ______, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" (Exo 32:1-4)

An easily overlooked weak spot for many of us is **control**. When we lose it, it's easy to make fools of ourselves (Exo 32:21-24). Let's talk about that...
