What <b>sort</b> of fruit? Listen carefully to John's first letter:
God is, and whoever abides in love
abides in God, and God abides in him. (1 John 4:16)
Anyone who does not love does not
God, because God is love. In this the love of God
was made manifest among us, that God sent his only
Son into the world, so that we might live through
him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but
that he loved us and sent his Son to be the
propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us,
also ought to
one another. (1 John 4:8-11)
The fruit of the Spirit is <b>LOVE</b> —
doing what is for others
because we about
them. What does love <i>look</i> like?
Love is and
kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant
or rude. It does not on its own way;
it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at
wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love
all things, believes all things, hopes all
things, endures all things. (1 Cor 13:4-7)
