What is the Fruit of the Spirit? BULLE Spirit? The Spirit's Fruit: JOY Spirit? Part 3

"I am the; you are the
Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that
bears much"
What sort of fruit?
The fruit of the Spirit is love, (Gal 5:22)
What is this JOY ? Keeping a positive attitude because we God loves us. Where can we learn more?
Paul's letter to the Philippians is a great resource:
And it is my prayer that your love may abound
more and more, with knowledge and all
discernment, so that you may approve what is
excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the
day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness
that comes Jesus Christ, to the
glory and praise of God. (Phil 1:9-11)
Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours Christ Jesus (Phil 2:5)
Finally, my brothers, rejoice the Lord. (Phil 3:1)
Rejoice the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. (Phil 4:4)
Or, as Paul put it in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18: Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks all circumstances; for this is the will of God Christ, lesus for you

When we walk by the Spirit, connected to Jesus, we'll

bear the fruit of **joy** because we **know** God loves us.

In John 15:5, Jesus taught this foundational truth:

For Class & Family Discussion:

- Does this joy we're talking about always come naturally to us? If not, why not? What might be getting in the way?
- "Happiness" is often described as if it depends on whether or not we like what's happening around and to us. How is the mindset revealed in Habakkuk 3:17-18 very different? How is it better?
- Can you think of other examples of men or women in the Bible who kept a positive attitude because they **knew** God loved them?
- How does the description of Jesus and what he did in Hebrews 12:1-2 help us understand what joy really is? What are we being called to do as we follow in his footsteps?
- How does "walking by" the Spirit (Gal 5:16), following the "lead" of the Spirit (Gal 5:18), "keeping in step" with the Spirit (Gal 5:25) and "sowing to" the Spirit (Gal 6:8) produce the fruit of joy?
