After we were brought safely through, we then learned that the island was called Malta. The native people showed us **unusual** ______, for they kindled a fire and welcomed us all, because it had begun to rain and was cold. (Acts 28:1-2)

Kindness is fruit that God expects from **all** of us:

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, ______ in Christ forgave you. (Eph 4:32)

Closely related to kindness is the fruit of **GOODNESS**– learning what ______ God and doing it.

Notice how **Romans 12:9-21** is full of the Spirit's fruit:

Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is _____. (12:9)

- In everyday terms, how can evil be "overcome" with good? (Rom 12:21)
- How does "walking by" the Spirit (Gal 5:16), following the "lead" of the Spirit (Gal 5:18), "keeping in step" with the Spirit (Gal 5:25) and "sowing to" the Spirit (Gal 6:8) produce the fruit of kindness and goodness?
