

Last January we asked a really **BIG**, really important question: Who is God? Exodus 3:13-14 helped us answer that really **BIG** question:

Then Moses said to God, "If I come to the people of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel: '\_\_\_\_\_ has sent me to you.'"

God has always been. He's everywhere, knows everything, and can do anything. But what is he LIKE? Can you open your Bible to Exodus 34:6 and listen to a REALLY important verse?

The LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD, a God \_\_\_\_\_\_ and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness..."

God is **MERCIFUL**. He is **compassionate** and **tenderhearted**. People can have **compassion** in their hearts, like Joseph did when he saw his little brother Benjamin (Gen 43:30). But God, our Father in heaven, shows perfect **compassion** (Psa 103:13; Isa 55:7).

Maybe it's hard to understand what compassion looks like in real life, which is why Jesus, the Son of God, is such a wonderful example for us! Jesus is **MERCIFUL** in the flesh (Matt 9:36; Mark 1:40-41; 1 Pet 2:24).

But Jesus has done more than serve as a really good example for us. He's called us to be like him and like our Father in heaven.

"Be merciful, even as your \_\_\_\_\_\_ is merciful." (Luke 6:36)

Or, as the apostle Paul put it in Ephesians 4:32:



Be \_\_\_\_\_\_ to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. What is God like? God is **merciful**. He is compassionate and tenderhearted and he wants us to be too!
