
What is God Like? 05 / Abounding in Faithfulness

The LORD passed before [Moses] and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and ______..." (Exo 34:6)



Faithfulness in Scripture is closely related to stability and reliability. In Exodus 17, the Israelites were attacked by the Amalekites. Whenever Moses held up his hand, Israel prevailed, so Aaron and Hur helped to keep Moses' hands "______" until the going down of the sun (17:12). When Moses was looking for "able men" to help lead Israel, he looked for "trustworthy" men (Exo 18:21). Steady and trustworthy are from the same root word for faithfulness.

In Deuteronomy 32, when Moses wanted to poetically describe this "God of faithfulness," what better word picture could he use for **stability** and **reliability** than "the ______" (32:4)? We've learned this month that God is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. This last attribute—**faithfulness**—emphasizes the truth that God will be consistent to his character.

- His "testimony" is "_____" (Psa 19:7)
- His "rules" are "_____" (Psa 19:9)

It's no wonder, then, that leaders like Joshua would call the people to serve the LORD "in sincerity and in " (Josh 24:14).

In the New Testament, God's faithfulness is most clearly seen in Jesus Christ (1 Cor 1:9; Rom 15:8-9; 2 Cor 1:20). When I hear his words and do them, I am like "a wise man who built his house on the _____" (Matt 7:24). Because our God abounds in faithfulness, when we build our lives on him, we can be " and "immovable" (1 Cor 15:58).

What is God like? He overflows with faithfulness.

For Class & Family Discussion:

- When you think of a person as "steady," "stable," "reliable," "trustworthy" ... what comes to mind?
- Let's read the wisdom of Proverbs 27:6 together. In what way are the "wounds" of a friend "faithful"?
- Why is it very good news that God will be "consistent" to his character?
- How do passages like
 Malachi 3:6 and Hebrews
 13:8 help us understand that good news?
- So what, then, will it look like for us to serve the LORD "in sincerity and in faithfulness" (Josh 24:14)?
- ► In Romans 5:1-5, Paul describes how suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope. How can hard times actually help us develop faithful character that is "steadfast" and "immovable" in our walk with Jesus?
