The Trees of the Bible
From a tree in a garden, to a tree on a hill of death, to a tree in a heavenly city, if you understand the trees, you're well on your way to understanding the Bible's story—a story that can be summarized by God's call to " and"
Trust: our, the refreshment and stability of our hearts (Eph 3:14-19a).
<b>Obey</b> : our and fullness (Eph 3:19b-21).
In the beginning, God (Gen 1-2)
After forming Adam "of dust from the ground" and breathing into his nostrils "the breath of life," God planted a(2:7-9a)
Our God is a gracious, giving us what we need and so much more (Rom 1:19-21; Matt 6:25-33)
Two were "in the midst" of the garden (Gen 2:9b)
Fundamental to life in the garden was a(2:15-17)
To <i>prohibit</i> is to forbid; to prevent or hinder. Why? (Isa 55:8-9)
The serpent tempted Eve (Gen 3:1-6) by luring and enticing her with her own(James 1:13-15)
Ever since, this is the battleground (1 John 2:15-17; Mark 4:3-20)
