

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah... "Arise, \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me." (Jonah I:1-2)

Nineveh was a "great city" where more than 120,000 people lived. But they didn't know or obey God! So God wanted Jonah to go to them. "But Jonah rose to \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ to Tarshish from

the presence of the LORD" (Jonah 1:3). Why? The answer can be found in Jonah's prayer to God in Jonah 4:2:

"O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a \_\_\_\_\_

God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster."

Jonah didn't want the people of Nineveh to listen to God.

He didn't want God to be gracious to them. He wanted them to be punished. But could Jonah REALLY run from God? Not at all (1:4-16). Eventually, Jonah was thrown into the sea and swallowed by a great fish. "And Jonah was in the belly of the fish \_\_\_\_ days and \_\_\_\_ nights" (1:17).

But what does all of this have to do with our search for our King? Listen carefully to what happened many years later in Matthew 12:38-41:

Then some of the scribes and Pharisees answered [Jesus], saying, "Teacher, w	ve wish to see a
sign from you." But he answered them, "An evil and adulterous generation seeks for a sign, but no	
sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet	. For just as Jonah
was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of	Man be three days
and three nights in the heart of the earth. The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this	
generation and condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and bel	hold, something
than Jonah is here."
