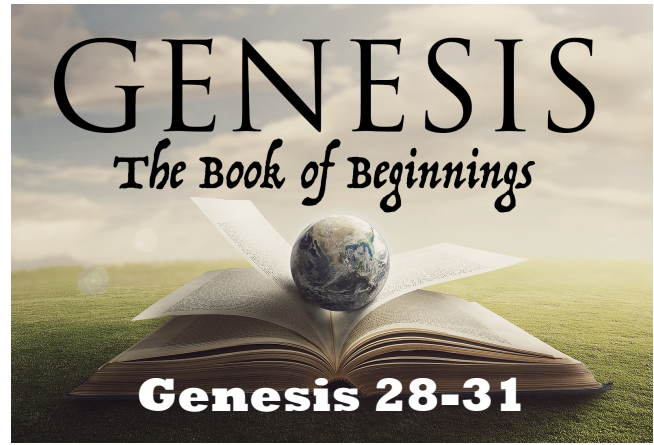


9 • The Beginning of Descendants From Jacob



When we last left Jacob, his brother Esau was taking comfort in his plan to *kill* Jacob for cheating him out of his blessing (27:42). In **Genesis 28**, Isaac encourages his son Jacob to go to Paddan-aram, to the house of Jacob’s uncle, _____.

“God Almighty bless you and make you fruitful and multiply you, that you may become a company of peoples. May he give the _____ of _____ to you and to your offspring with you, that you may take possession of the land of your sojournings that God gave to Abraham!” (28:3-4)

On his way, Jacob has an incredible dream.

...behold, there was a _____ set up on the earth, and the top of it reached to heaven. And behold, the angels of God were ascending and descending on it! And behold, the _____ stood above it...



And the LORD had a message for Jacob:

“I am the LORD, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac. The land on which you lie I will give to _____ and to your offspring. Your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south, and in you and your offspring shall all the families of the earth be _____.” (28:12-14)

In **Genesis 29**, Jacob reaches his destination and meets his uncle Laban.

Now Laban had two daughters. The name of the older was _____, and the name of the younger was _____. Leah’s eyes were weak, but Rachel was beautiful in form and appearance. Jacob loved Rachel. (29:16-18)

But in the next few verses, the cheater gets cheated as Laban gives Leah as a wife to Jacob instead of Rachel! Throughout **Genesis 29-30**, we read all about the beginning of many descendants being born:

- What small insight might we have about Jacob and the way he perceives his relationship with God in [31:5](#)?
- Notice again how Jacob describes God in [31:42](#). How would you describe his present frame of mind and faith? [Genesis 31:53](#) might also be helpful here...
