"Who is God?" That's the really important question we're exploring together, and we've learned so far that God is our Creator, the great "I AM" who has always been, is everywhere, knows everything, and can do anything. Psalm 19:1-6 is a good summary of where we've been so far in this study.



But here's a really, really important question: is such a powerful being GOOD? Just because someone is powerful doesn't automatically mean that they are good or do good, and that's what makes Psalm 19:7-11 such good news.

 - Are they really worth more than a whole lot of gold? If so, in what ways?
 - Notice how David concludes this thought in 19:11. What do you think he means?
- In your own words, what does it mean to "be holy" (1 Pet 1:15-16)?
- How does sin sometimes make it look like it would be a really good idea to wander away from God? Is that ever a good idea?
- If we're going to "walk in the light" (1 John 1:7) this week, what's that going to look like?
