



“For the LORD will pass through ... and when he sees the \_\_\_\_\_ on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the LORD will pass over the door...” (Exo 12:21-23)

Israel had lived in Egypt for \_\_\_\_\_ years (12:40), most of that time as slaves.

- God sent Moses to tell the stubborn Pharaoh, “Let my people \_\_\_\_\_” (5:1).
- After nine terrible \_\_\_\_\_ (Exo 7-10), Pharaoh’s heart was still hard, so God promised the worst plague of all (11:4-7).

In Exodus 12, God provided a \_\_\_\_\_ (12:1-11).

- It was going to be a terrible night outside for all who ignored God (12:12).
- But the blood on those doorposts would be a \_\_\_\_\_ that the people on the inside of those houses believed in the one true God (12:13, 28; Heb 11:28).
- For the rest of their lives, once a year, every year, the children of Israel were to remember “the LORD’s \_\_\_\_\_” (12:24-27).

3. \_\_\_\_\_ is available by the blood of God’s Lamb (Rev 12:10-11), but only if we \_\_\_\_\_ it to our lives (Rom 3:22-26; 5:6-9; 6:1-4; Eph 1:7; 2:13).
4. As we follow Jesus, we won’t always be \_\_\_\_\_ the world (1 John 2:15-16), but the world is \_\_\_\_\_ away (2:17). In Jesus, we’re safe and secure (Rom 8:1).
