

In John 9:35, we'll hear Jesus ask one of the most important questions anyone can be asked: "Do you in the Son of Man?" John has written what we have in his Gospel—including the events in John 9—so that we may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God (20:30-31). How can John 9 help us believe in him so that we can have life in his name?

As the healed man is brought to the Pharisees, notice who the "blind" people really are:

They were told how Jesus had healed this man: "He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see" (9:15). They were asked a great question: "How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?" (9:16). They heard for a second time the straightforward truth from the once blind man: "One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see" (9:25). The evidence was crystal clear: "Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing" (9:32-33). And yet, the Pharisees were the truly "blind" ones (9:39-41).

For Class & Family Discussion:

•	Why do you think the disciples asked the question they did in 9:2? Do you see any problem with the way they were thinking?
•	In your own words, what is Jesus saying with his answer in 9:3-5?
•	In what ways were the Pharisees the truly "blind" ones throughout John 9? Is there anything we can learn from their bad attitudes?
•	Are people sometimes "blind" in the same way today? If so, in what ways?
•	What do we need to do to make sure we don't make the same mistakes that the Pharisees made in John 9?
•	Throughout this study, we've been talking about the power of the "signs" that Jesus provided. How do 9:16 and 9:32-33 show us again the power of those "signs"?
•	Did you notice the progression of the healed man, how he talked about Jesus throughout the chapter? Notice the words he uses to describe Jesus in 9:11, 9:17, 9:33, and 9:35-38. How did he move from "The man called Jesus" to "Lord, I believe"?
•	What do you think Jesus meant in 9:39?
•	How does what we have seen throughout John 9 help us believe all the more that what Jesus claimed in 8:58 is actually true?
